Grant Avenue Pathway and Drainage Improvement Project

Project Description

The Grant Avenue Pathway and Drainage Improvement Project will provide multi-modal and environmentally responsible community improvements on Grant Avenue between Via Seco and the Union Pacific Railroad in San Lorenzo, CA. The objective of the project is to provide safe and sustainable community improvements serving the multi-modal transportation needs of the residents, the school children, and nearby business.

The project will provide better pedestrian and bicycle accessibility and safety along Grant Avenue. Planned improvements include multi-use pathway construction, pavement rehabilitation, and Bay Friendly certified landscaping, and storm drain improvements including rain garden drainage facilities. The improvements will complete an important pedestrian and bicycle transportation link between the residential areas of San Lorenzo with the San Francisco Bay Trail.

Project Features

- Construction of multi-use pathways on both sides of Grant Avenue between Via Seco and the Union Pacific Railroad
- Resurfacing of the roadway pavement
- Installation storm water drainage systems including bio-swales
- Installation of Bay Friendly Certified landscaping
- Installation of Class II Bicycle Lanes
